

Kalle Puolakka obtained his doctorate from the University of Helsinki in 2009, with a thesis on the philosophy of interpretation. He currently works as a university researcher of aesthetics at the International Institute of Applied Aesthetics (IIAA) at the same university. In 2012, he was granted the title of docent (adjunct professor) in aesthetics by the University of Helsinki. Puolakka has also been a fellow at the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study (Uppsala). He joined the ESA committee in 2012 and currently serves as the secretary of the society. He is also a board member of the Nordic Society for Aesthetics, as well as past secretary of the Finnish Society for Aesthetics. Puolakka is editor-in-chief of the Finnish online philosophical encyclopedia *Logos*. As part of his research position at the IIAA, Puolakka has been responsible for arranging three international conferences on environmental aesthetics, which have all been held in the city of Lahti: “Aesthetics of Human Spaces. Between Urban and Nature” (2011), “Values in the Environment – Relations and Conflicts” (2013), and “Sustainable City Life. Exploring Aesthetic Values in Urban Settings” (to be held in August 2015).

Puolakka’s publication record includes the book *Relativism and Intentionalism in Interpretation. Davidson, Hermeneutics, and Pragmatism* (Lexington Books, 2011), as well as around twenty peer-reviewed articles in both Finnish and international journals of aesthetics and philosophy.
